ITSEA & Bayley's

A year has come around quickly, which means that in just 12 months neurodevelopmental follow-up will begin. The planned follow up being in the form of the ITSEA questionare and the Bayley's assessment. Both are important tools for assessing and formulating the primary outcome for the trial, which is neurodevelopmental outcomes of all baby's involved in Protect Me.

Watch this space, though as we change to Bayley's IV assessment ahead of beginning our neurodevelopmental follow-up.

The team is in the process of ensuring these assessments are easily accessible to all our participant's.

COVID-19

Since the beginning of the pandemic the Protect Me Team have been ensuring all aspects of the trial limit any risk from COVID for both patients and staff.

With many appointments moving to Telehealth format initial mention of the trial has often been reliant on our colleagues during their consultation. We are truly grateful for your support with the trial by doing so. Gaining permission to make contact through this process has enabled us to offer partcipation to all women who meet eligibility criteria. The structure of antenatal trial follow-up has always been tailored to routine antenatal appointments, thus ensuring particpants are not required to have any additional hospital attendance.

Our thoughts during these challenging times are with our front line colleagues and our families that are already facing a complex pregnancy and postnatal period.

Branching out

Protect Me will be expanding to another possible 15 sites throughout Australia & New Zealand. Excitingly we will be welcoming on board Sunshine Hospital and multiple Hospitals across New Zealand soon, as they are in the final processes of setting up.

We welcomed on board The Mercy Hospital for Women in March, however Covid-19 has had a major impact on recruitment there. We remain hopeful to see the first Mercy partipant in the near future. Our thoughts are with the team at the Mercy as they continue to keep mother's and babies safe during this time.
